Abstract:

Team Based Care in a Primary Care Setting

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Background:

Team based care contributes to reduced physician burnout and increases patient access to physicians in a nation where over 100 million individuals do not have a primary care provider. Additionally, this clinic model improves continuity within provider teams.

Methods:

Patient continuity prior to the implementation of team-based care was compared to patient continuity after the implementation of team-based care with use of note templates specific to each individual team.

Results and Conclusions:

Data analysis is still in progress at this time; however, in the 6-month period after the implementation of team-based care (May 2022-December 2022), it was noted that team-specific template use was approximately 34.77%. This investigation is currently still ongoing, and we plan to complete data analysis by the end of February 2024, with our final results to be presented at research day. Our hypothesis is that the implementation of team-based care has increased patient panel continuity.
